### Housing

NYC Eviction Prevention Tool- in English / Spanish.

NYC Tenant Helpline

- For personalized legal assistance on housing issues call 311 then say "Tenant Helpline."
- If you are facing an eviction case, you can receive free legal assistance through HRA's Office of Civil Justice and the City's "right-to-counsel" law.

COVID Rent Relief Program

- Application is due by February 1st, 2021.
- For immigrants, consult with the Office for New Americans or an immigration attorney for assistance.

### Health

Vaccinations

- Free for children up to 2 years of age are available at NYC Health + Hospitals. Call (844-692-4692) to make an appointment.

Applying for Health Insurance

- Applying won't affect immigration status or application for status. Immigration status won't be shared with federal authorities.

Child Health Plus Insurance

- All children under 19 years of age are potentially eligible regardless of income or immigration status.

COVID-19

- USCIS has stated that it will not consider testing, treatment, nor preventative care for Public Charge purposes.

### Food

NYC Food Map

- Includes "Grab & Go Meals" Locations, Food Pantries / Mobile Food Pantries, Soup Kitchens / Mobile Soup Kitchens, Grocery Stores, Farm Stands, and More.

### Legal

ActionNYC Hotline

- Provides NYC residents, regardless of immigration status, with free, comprehensive immigration legal screenings, legal representation, accurate and timely immigration-related information, and referrals to City-funded and community-based resources and services.
- Call 1-800-354-0365 then say ActionNYC. 9am-6pm M-F.

Medicaid

- You can apply for Medicaid, Child Health Plus and the Essential Plan any time of the year.
- For children under age 21 and pregnant women, enrollment won't be considered to be a public benefit under the public charge rule.
- DACAmented New Yorkers with Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals status can qualify for Medicaid.
- If you are undocumented and not pregnant, you can still get Medicaid for emergency services, as long as you meet other requirements.

Victims of Trafficking and Other Crimes

- Asylees, refugees, and visa holders are entirely exempt from the Public Charge Rule.
